A: NO! We currently have space for 2 coopted councillors which means that you are appointed by the parish council and will hopefully serve until the next local election.

Q: Do I have to belong to a political party?

A: NO! You can if you want to but the work of the parish councillor is very much grass roots level rather than political lobbying.

Q: Will there be masses of meetings?

A: NO! The parish council meets once every other month on the second Thursday of the month starting at 7.00pm at the village hall. Meetings last approx. 2 hours.

Q: I have never been a councillor before and I won't know what to do!

A: The parish clerk and other councillors are there to support you every step of the way. There are also training courses available.

Q: How do I become a co-opted councillor?

A: Simply drop the parish clerk an email: <u>chadwickendpc@hotmail.com</u> and say why you would like to join our merry band. There is no deadline date.

So when you ask yourself 'What did I do today?' You may soon be able to answer – supported the parish in decisions around planning, improving the appearance of the village, solved highways issues, enhanced access to the countryside, developed a parish plan, ran community events What's stopping you?
